

BAND LETTERHEAD

Letter of Confirmation of Residence

You can use this letter as proof of your address – along with a second piece of ID – to register and vote in a federal election.

What you need to know:

- This proof of address will be valid **only** if it is signed by the First Nation band administrator or an authority designated by the band.
- If you live on reserve, you can print this letter and ask the band administrator or designated band authority to complete and sign it.
- The band administrator or designated band authority should contact the local returning officer¹ to make sure the correct band name and address is listed with the Elections Canada. If it is not on the list, this letter will not be accepted at the polls.
- When you go to vote, bring this letter and a second piece of ID with your name on it (such as a status card).
